In California, all kids count.









What's at Stake

Amount of federal funding the state receives annually for programs that affect kids

MEDICAID: \$55.5B SNAP (FOOD STAMPS): \$7.2B TANF (CASH ASSISTANCE): \$3.7B SECTION 8 (HOUSING): \$3.5B SCHIP (HEALTH INSURANCE): \$2B SPECIAL EDUCATION: \$1.3B HEAD START: \$1.2B CCDBG (CHILD CARE): \$303M

 PARENT YOU CAN!










Timeline









How to Fill Out the Census

Online or by phone

English, Spanish or 11 other languages
Can fill it out on your smartphone!

Try to respond to Census on time (by April 30,2020)
No internet? Can fill it out by mail
Visit local QAC

Privacy



• IS MY INFORMATION PROTECTED?- YES!

- By law, US Census Bureau must keep your information private
- It is illegal for US Census Bureau to share your information
- Census worker will never ask for your Social Security information
- If you want to make sure the person at your door is really a Census worker, check their badge







Immigration



• IS THERE AN IMMIGRATION QUESTION? -- NO!

- Census will not ask if you are a US citizen
- You do not need to worry about your own immigration status or anyone else living at your address
- Administration tried to add this question to the 2020 Census, but the question was NOT added to the survey. EVERYONE should respond to the Census
- Illegal for Census to share information w/anyone



Young Children

In California, all kids count.

• DO WE COUNT BABIES? – YES! YES! YES!

- Count ALL kids living at your address- this includes nieces, nephews, grandchildren, foster children, and people not related to you if they are living with you on April 1, 2020
- Babies born on or before April 1 need to be counted- even if they are still in the hospital
- Even if they are in split custody with parents- count them on where they spend the most time living, or where they are on April 1







Families Experiencing Homelessness

In California, all kids count.

• DO WE COUNT FAMILIES EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS? – YES!

- You don't need an address to participate in the Census
 - Can use address of a shelter or a geographic area where you sleep
- If you are temporarily staying with someone, make sure they include you on their household's census form







What If...

Addressing Barriers in Filling Out the Census







Language



• WHAT IF ENGLISH IS NOT MY FIRST LANGUAGE?

- Filling out the Census form for your address is easy. You can respond to the Census online or by phone in English, Spanish, or 11 other languages. You can even do it on your smartphone!
- Video and printed guides are also available in 59 non-English languages.
- There will also be a printed guide in braille and one with large print.



Time



• I DON'T HAVE TIME TO FILL IT OUT

- It's easy to fill out- can fill it out anywhere, anytime- online from any device or by mail or phone
- Just 7 questions- can be done in 5 minutes







Impact

In California, all kids count.

• I DON'T COUNT & IT WON'T IMPACT ME

- The 2020 Census helps decide how much money your community will get for important programs, including:
 - SCHIP (health insurance)
 - Medi-Cal (health insurance)
 - CalFresh (Food Stamps/SNAP)
 - WIC
 - School Breakfast and Lunch Programs
 - Head Start & Early Head Start
 - Child Care
 - Special Education
 - Cash Assistance
 - Section 8 Housing



Multi-Family Household

In California, all kids count.

• I HAVE MORE THAN ONE FAMILY IN MY HOUSEHOLD

- It's very important that you count everyone living in your house or apartment.
- It does not matter if they are not listed on the lease or rental agreement.
 - By law, the U.S. Census Bureau cannot share your information with your landlord.





Homelessness



• I'M HOMELESS AND I DON'T COUNT

You don't need an address to participate in the Census
Can use address of a shelter or a geographic area where you sleep
If you are temporarily staying with someone, make sure they include you on their household's census form







Immigration



• I WON'T FILL IT OUT BECAUSE I DON'T WANT THE GOVERNMENT TO USE THIS INFORMATION AGAINST ME DUE TO MY IMMIGRATION STATUS

- Census will not ask if you are a US citizen
- You do not need to worry about your own immigration status or anyone else living at your address
- Administration tried to add this question to the 2020 Census, but the question was NOT added to the survey. EVERYON should respond to the Census
- Illegal for Census to share information w/anyone
